Wounded warrior hosting event, "That Others May Live"

Las Vegas, NV – June 9 marks a solemn occasion for many families associated with United States Air Force Search and Rescue. For MSgt. Christopher "Aggie" Aguilera and the families who lost a husband, father, son or brother, it marks the beginning of a new chapter for a life changed forever. Aggie is one of two survivors of Pedro 66, the call sign for the helicopter shot down while conducting a rescue mission in Afghanistan June 9, 2010.

Wishing to honor those who passed away and one other who survived the incident, Aggie contacted That Others May Live Foundation with his idea of a Poker Run fundraiser in Las Vegas, Nevada, home to his 66 Rescue Squadron at Nellis AFB. Dubbing the event, Pedro 66 Remember the Fallen Poker Run, the event will be held not only in Las Vegas but also in Valdosta, Georgia, where members of the rescue community decided to volunteer their time to host the same event in their area.

"I really wanted to bring awareness to the rescue mission and families who have lost so much over the past year," says Aguilera. Continuing, "That Others May Live Foundation really stepped up and helped the families with immediate tragedy assistance and will further assist with post secondary education of the kids who lost their dad in Pedro 66."

The term That Others May Live comes from the motto of search and rescue which is in part, "...these things we do, That Others May Live," and is also a way of life for the team which comprises rescue. The professionals of search and rescue are trained and ready to risk their lives to save lives in both military and civilian scenarios and are responsible for thousands of saves. But in the course of such dangerous work, tragedies may occur and That Others May Live Foundation provides scholarships, family counseling and aid to surviving children of Air Force Rescue Heroes who gave the ultimate sacrifice.

The upcoming anniversary of Pedro 66 will enable attendees to remember and honor the memories of the five Fallen Rescue Heroes: Capt. David Wizniewski, 1st Lt. Joel C.
